With the Flu Season upon us, Local 1262 urges our members to get their Annual Flu Shot in addition to keeping up with COVID boosters.

Influenza (flu) and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses, however they are caused by two different viruses and thus need two different vaccines.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that everyone 6 months of age and older get an annual flu vaccine. The CDC is also urging all adults to stay up to date with COVID vaccines, including the new bivalent booster, which targets the original COVID strain and the two most recent Omicron subvariants.

Opinions on getting the flu vaccination and COVID booster at the same time vary and are up to the individual patient. If you are uncertain about the timing of your vaccinations, speak to your doctor.

Members who live in New Jersey and have medical coverage can get free flu vaccinations at participating in-network pharmacies including ShopRite, Stop & Shop and Acme. In New York members with medical coverage can go to their in-network doctor's office or to a CVS Minute Clinic that participates in the Blue Cross/Blue Shield Network.

You must present your medical card - not prescription card -- to receive free flu shots.

As masking and social distancing becoming less prevalent, many experts predict a particularly severe flu season this year. Stay safe and make your appointment today.
